To win peace, we must not ignore these truths:

- Capitalism and war go hand in hand. The military industrial complex is at the heart of America's economy. An economy built around expanding war production fuels the drive toward war. The military industrial complex can't be rooted out without changing the entire system.
- Another factor fueling the drive for war is the struggle for global domination by the big corporations. Their strategy is to contain competitor nations through the control of oil and turn them into markets for U.S. products. Hence the war in Iraq.
- Every bomb dropped not only kills and maims Iraqis but means someone's child here goes without health care while some corporation makes a profit—the war is also a war on us.
- The struggle for peace is about more than getting rotten politicians out. The future of humanity is at stake. In the end, this fight is about getting rid of this system and replacing it with a cooperative society where the people have political power and the big corporations are publicly owned and under popular control.

WHAT PEOPLE CAN DO: The American people must recognize the need for a new society in which the \$2 Billion spent every week on the destruction of Iraq is spent instead on education, health care, or housing. They must also recognize that the corporations are able to continue war because, today, they have become the government. Thus, to achieve peace, we, the people, must take power from the corporations.
